

## Influential Women Artist Supply List

Check to see if you already have some of these supplies before purchasing. For specific examples for those things listed with an asterisk, you can find them on an Amazon List at <https://a.co/877TYVS> . It is highly recommended that you purchase each item (or the equivalent) before the start of class if you do not already have access to them. You only need one of each unless otherwise stated. In some cases, we found that some of the items come in multiple packs on Amazon at a lower price than buying individually. Some things you can find at Dollar Tree, Allard's Art, GSW School Supply, Michael's, Office Depot or other stores at a lower price than on Amazon.

- Aluminum Craft Wire (12 gauge)\*
- Mod Podge – gloss – 8 oz\*
- Tissue paper - assorted colors or just black (Dollar Tree has best price)
- Tacky glue \*
- Antique bronze paint \*
- Glue stick (Dollar Tree) \*
- Inexpensive sketch pad (Dollar Tree) 9" x 12" or 8 1/2 " x 11" white paper (for design ideas)
- Scissors (sharp)
- Exacto knife (#11)\*
- Foam brush\*
- Assorted paint brushes from very small to large\*
- 8" x 10" canvas panel \* (can also use corrugated cardboard, white foam core, wooden board instead, or buy a single canvas at Michael's or Allard's)
- Celluclay Instant Papier Mache\*
- Acrylic gesso – white – 8 oz\*
- White acrylic paint\*
- Assorted colors of acrylic paint (or just primary colors will work)\*
- Plastic palette knife\*
- Black construction paper 10" x 12"\*
- White construction paper, 12" x 18" \* (11" x 17" cardstock would be great too)
- Elanze Designs Classic White 6-inch Resin Harvest Decorative Pumpkin\* (as an alternative, you can use a small old plastic pumpkin that you can paint with white gesso)
- Pencil/eraser (standard, 2B) and sharpener \*
- Thrift store or old soup bowl and spoon that might be chipped and no one uses anymore. Could also get from Dollar Tree.

### Household items you may already have:

- Paper or plastic plate or vegetable or meat tray for palette (preferably white)
- A few rubber bands

- Small water spritzer bottle (to keep acrylics from drying out when on your palette) – you can find them in travel section of most drug stores or at Dollar Tree
- Paper towels
- Apron or old t-shirt to protect clothes
- Old newspaper to cover work surface
- Water jar (any wide-mouth, empty 5” or 6” high container will work)
- Water access to clean brushes
- Cardboard from corrugated box to use for cutting surface with Exacto knife

**Additional items needed:** toilet paper rolls, buttons, machine parts, wire, toy parts, recycled plastic pieces, old jewelry, foamboard or heavy cardboard scraps, small boxes, lids, nuts, bolts, wood scraps, broken glasses, popsicle sticks. Ask your parents if you can clean out their junk drawer to find odds and ends. All of these things to be used in an assemblage.
